Editorial

Soil is one of the most precious natural resources, supporting about 98.8% of global food production and acting as a major carbon sink by storing nearly 2,500 gigatons of carbon—more than the atmosphere and vegetation combined—while delivering ecosystem services valued at approximately US\$11.4 trillion annually. However, rapid population growth, urbanization, climate change, and intensive agriculture are placing immense pressure on soil resources, particularly in South Asia, where one-fourth of the world's population lives on just 4.5% of global land and agriculture contributes over 18% to regional GDP while supporting the livelihoods of more than two-thirds of the rural population. As a result, soils are increasingly affected by erosion, salinity, waterlogging, nutrient imbalance, organic carbon depletion, biodiversity loss, and contamination, with water erosion alone degrading about 21% of land and costing nearly US\$10 billion annually. Alarming soil erosion rates such as a rise in Pakistan's average erosion rate to 2.47 t/ha, reaching 28 t/ha in hilly areas, severe riverbank erosion in Bangladesh and annual losses of up to 38.4 t/ha in Nepal's Middle Mountains, pose serious threats to food security and livelihoods. Unsustainable practices including residue burning, monocropping, excessive tillage, and imbalanced fertilizer use further exacerbate soil degradation, highlighting the urgent need for community-based conservation agriculture, agroecological approaches, diversified cropping systems, balanced nutrient management, and improved organic matter restoration to enhance soil health, climate resilience, and long-term agricultural productivity.

International Symposium Soil Organic Carbon

Dean, Faculty of Life Sciences, Prof. Dr. Farhat Jabeen, remarked that maintaining the balance of soil organic carbon is vital for environmental sustainability and reducing the impacts of climate change. The symposium featured keynote



addresses and scientific discussions by experts from Oman, the United Arab Emirates, Turkey, France, Spain, Australia, and China, along with prominent environmental scientists from various Pakistani universities. The event aimed to foster dialogue, collaboration, and research on soil conservation, sustainable development, and innovative approaches to mitigate climate challenges.
